Testing begins on April 18, 2022 also.

Testing starts at 6:00 PM at the Church on the third Monday and ends in time for the Klub Meeting for 7:00 PM.

The new FCC rules go into effect on April 19, 2022. Therefore, all testing beginning on April 18, 2022 require the following;

Those taking the Tech Exam for the first time must go to the FCC web site and apply for a FRN number. No one may take a test without first getting a FRN number.

You will be required to pay to the FCC \$35 before you can be granted a license and a call sign. The actual testing fee remains at \$14, payable in cash only, when you come to take the test. You will also need a picture ID for verification and a copy of your FRN number.

Please go to <u>ARRL</u> and read the notice. Hope to see many new hams.

PARK Proxy Voting April 2022

Proxy Voting

PARK members who choose not to attend the General Meeting on April 18, 2022, may vote by Proxy. There are two ways to accomplish this;

- 1- You may send your vote in a sealed envelope. You must use the form that says Proxy "PARK Proxy Voting April 2022' which is attached at the bottom. You must fill-in the blanks with your name and call sign, your email or the member bringing your Proxy vote to the meeting, the date you signed this form, and you must sign your name. (Any member may only bring 2(two) Proxies to the meeting.
- 2- You may email your filled-out Proxy vote to me at <u>secretary@K5prk.net</u> Please note emails must be received (received time not sent time) by me by 5:00 PM on Monday, (so send it by 4:30 pm) April 18, 2022. I will leave my house a few minutes after I check for late emails at 5:00pm in order to prepare for the meeting. Once you receive this notice you may send me your Proxy vote early as long as you are sure you will not be attending the meeting. If you are not sure about attending, please wait until the morning of the meeting.

Each member is entitled to 1(one) vote.

Members attending the meeting will be given one ballot when they sign-in to the meeting.

Ballots must be turned into me during the break.



What is Amateur Radio (Ham Radio?) from ARRL

Amateur radio is a multifaceted hobby that includes people around the world. There are about 740,000 ham radio operators in the US. The FCC has allocated <u>30 different frequency bands</u> from 135 KHz to greater than 275 GHz to amateur radio operators. These frequency bands are used for many different aspects of the hobby.
