Our Repeaters

Our October club meeting is all about the repeaters. We will discuss the equipment as well as what modes are available. Check out the slide deck if you weren't able to attend the meeting. We have a lot going on right now with the PARK repeaters...

Main Repeater - Allen Prestige Water Tower

The UPS is reinstalled and operational. We are in the planning mode again to climb the water tower. We need to replace two masts and repoint the Ubiquiti antennas, And check the status of the rest of the antennas, Make sure everything is still grounded and the coax looks OK.

Texas Health Presbyterian Hospital Plano

The repeater is operational but we will be realigning the Ubiquiti antenna to point at Medical City Plano once that site is operational.

Medical City Plano

We are in the process of planning the installation of the repeaters at MCP. This will hopefully take place in the very near future. Like Presby Plano, this is not on a tower but the roof of their building so it does not require special skills to work on the antennas. Once MCP is up and running and Presby Plano is reconfigured our repeaters will be networked, allowing wider coverage during emergency nets.

Election Proxy Voting

PARK members who choose not to attend the General Meeting on Monday, October 16th, may vote by Proxy. There are two ways to accomplish this;

You must fill-in the blanks with your name and call sign, your email or the member bringing your Proxy vote to the meeting, the date you signed this form, and you must sign your name. (Any member may only bring 2(two) Proxies to the meeting.
- 2- You may email your filled-out Proxy vote to me at <u>secretary@K5prk.net</u> Please note emails must be received (received time not sent time) by me by 4:00 PM on Monday, (so send it by 3:30 pm) October 16th, 2023. I will leave my house a few minutes after I check for late emails at 5:30pm in order to prepare for the meeting. Once you receive this notice you may send me your Proxy vote early as long as you are sure you will not be attending the meeting. If you are not sure about attending, please wait until the morning of the meeting.

Each member is entitled to 1(one) ballot.

Please vote for each position

Members attending the meeting will be given one ballot when they signin to the meeting.

The BEST Robotics Technology Competition

For many years, PARK has supported the (CoCo) BEST (Collin County - Boosting Engineering, Science and Technology) program competition with communications support—from the staging area to the competition arena. Dave Koch, W8OV, has been the responsible party dedicated to the coordination of these communication operations. Due to health reasons, Dave is having to step down from this roll, and needs someone willing to take it over moving forward. While the competition itself only requires 3 communicators, it is an exciting way to spend a Saturday. How do we know it's an exciting event? If you have ever experienced listening to Dave talk about this event, then you are aware of how exciting it can be. "How these kids come up with these ideas--it's simply AMAZING!"

We need three radio operators to volunteer for this upcoming event. One person is needed to coordinate with the event director and then be available to participate with two other operators during the Saturday

competition. Although there is a check-in on Friday, the hams are usually only needed on Saturday (Game Day). That is October 28th, this year. The event usually runs from about 8 am to approximately 3 pm. Lunch for volunteers is provided. There are usually some light breakfast items provided, as well.

The CoCo BEST (Collin County) Hub was originally located in Collin County, as the name implies. However, a few years ago, another Hub located in another county closed its operations. So that the schools in that county would have a place to compete, the CoCo Best Hub took them in. To make travel a bit more equitable, and because finding a facility to use for the event is getting more difficult, the venue has moved, at times, to other counties.

This year's Game Day will be held in Denton, TX at Guyer High School at 7501 Teasley Lane, 76210. Just for refence, this is across, and North of the Denton County EOC.



In the end, it's not just about prizes, it's about getting on the air and having fun. To find out how to participate, visit the club website Member Activation Contest Page for more info.









What is Amateur Radio (Ham Radio?) from ARRL

Amateur radio is a multifaceted hobby that includes people around the world. There are about 740,000 ham radio operators in the US. The FCC has allocated <u>30 different frequency bands</u> from 135 KHz to greater than 275 GHz to amateur radio operators. These frequency bands are used for many different aspects of the hobby.
