PARK CONSTITUTION AMENDMENT

At the last two month's PARK meetings The PARK Board of Directors, in accordance with the PARK Constitution and By-Laws, notified the membership of a proposed PARK Constitution and By-Laws Amendment to offer complementary PARK membership to first-time licensed hams, in addition to our long-time practice of offering complementary membership to those to take and pass a PARK administered test.

In accordance with the PARK Constitution and By-Laws, this proposed Amendment will now be put before a vote of the membership at the December 18th, 2023 meeting.

Highlighted in Yellow below is the existing wording regarding complementary memberships, followed by the proposed change.

2. MEMBERSHIP – Applications for membership shall be submitted at a regular meeting in writing or via email to the club secretary. Each applicant must express a willingness to abide by the Constitution, By-Laws and other rules promulgated by the club. An applicant's Amateur Radio license status shall be verified by the club Secretary. The applicant shall become a member once their membership dues have been received. Unlicensed individuals taking and passing a license exam administered by the club, are eligible for a complimentary membership for the remainder of that calendar year.

Suggested By-Laws Section 2. Membership

2. MEMBERSHIP – Applications for membership shall be submitted at a regular meeting in writing or via email to the club secretary. Each applicant must express a willingness to abide by the Constitution, By-Laws and other rules promulgated by the club. An applicant's Amateur Radio license status shall be verified by the club Secretary. The applicant shall become a member once their membership dues have been received. Unlicensed individuals taking and passing a license exam administered by the club, and other first-time licensees (less than 1 year) who apply to become a member of PARK, are eligible for a complimentary membership for the remainder of that calendar year.

DO YOU SPOT?

Some of you may ask what is Spotting. Simply put Spotting is the ability to alert interested Hams that a particular Amateur Radio station is on the air. This other station may be a rare DX entity, a highly desired DXpedition, a Special Event Station, or even just another Ham. DX clusters are internetbased databases to which reports (Spots) are sent by Hams, announcing that a certain callsign is active, on a certain frequency, on a certain mode, at the time the report is made. These Spots may also contain notes with additional information. On the other side of the DX Cluster, these Spots can be viewed by other Hams who may find a station, a location, a mode, or other criteria that leads them to attempt to contact that station. There are many logging programs that give you the ability to easily Spot a station, and to see, sort and filter the Spots to meet your needs. Google "DX Spotting" for more information on Spotting.

DX Spotting and DX Clusters are great tools to let you know who is on the air, and where, but the one thing left unknown is ... will I be able to contact that station. To that end, I know of no better way to know that a band is open to somewhere, or that local Hams are working some elusive DXpedition, than for local Hams to simply tell each other. And we have the means of doing that available to us to-day.

Email Reflectors ...

PARK and other local clubs have Email reflectors (Groups.io, etc.) that enable local chatter, requests for help, and other announcements. In my mind local Spotting is also a proper and encouraged use. Spotting on local reflectors lets you know what DX - **IS** - being worked from your local area.

Another feature of local email reflector Spotting is that you don't need to in front of your radio or computer to get a timely tip of hot DX. Case in point, a few nights ago I was watching TV when I got an email from a local reflector with a local Ham reporting having just worked H44WA on 10 meters. I went into my shack and worked them on my second call. What could have been a missed opportunity became a new DX entity in my log, thanks to a local Ham spotting H44WA locally via email reflector.

In the spirit of Hams helping Hams, and helping one's friends and neighbors, I encourage and invite spotting on the PARK email reflector, and others you may also be a member of.

That spot you make may help someone else, and someone else's spot may get that ATNO in your log.

What is Amateur Radio (Ham Radio?) from ARRL

Amateur radio is a multifaceted hobby that includes people around the world. There are about 740,000 ham radio operators in the US. The FCC has allocated <u>30 different frequency bands</u> from 135 KHz to greater than 275 GHz to amateur radio operators. These frequency bands are used for many different aspects of the hobby.
