PARK Members,

Following the ARRL driven suggestion in regard to financial practices, and its discussion at the November General Meeting and the December Board of Directors meeting, the following revision to PARK's Constitution / Bylaws is proposed.

Existing Article V Section 5 -

The Treasurer shall receive and receipt all monies paid to this club; shall keep an accurate account of all monies received and expended and shall maintain a double entry bookkeeping system according to accepted accounting practices. The Treasurer shall pay no bills without proper authorization (by the club or its Board of Directors). At the end of each quarter, the Treasurer shall submit an itemized statement of disbursements and receipts. A petty cash fund may be established in accordance with the By-Laws.

This proposed revision would add the following to Article V Section 5 above: *"The Board of Directors may at any time, call for an audit of the klub's books / financial records."*

This addition is not a reaction to any issues, but a suggested proactive measure to help safeguard and protect the klub's financial assets, and the klub's Treasurer.

Following PARKs constitutionally required notifications, this proposed revision will be presented and recorded in the minutes of the December 2024 and January 2025 general meetings and brought before the membership for a vote at the February 2025 general meeting. – Tim

December 2024

There are a few upcoming activities/opportunities for our many club members to participate in. Between now and the end of the year, communications support for the Dallas Marathon and the Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day Meals-On-Wheels events will be needed. Dallas Marathon, December 13th**-15**th - Events for the Dallas Marathon occur all days of the event, but the major support event is the race(s) that happen on Sunday, the 15th. Meals – On – Wheels, November 28th and December 25th – This annual volunteer comms opportunity is a truly worthwhile experience. The Visiting Nurses Association of Dallas coordinates the Meals-On-Wheels program. Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day, each year, the VNA works with local volunteer organizations to provide the packing and delivery of the meals to the program recipients. The volunteers that arrive early in the morning, organize, and prepare to pack lined-up vehicles with food and supplies for delivery. These volunteers are typically local church organizations and youth groups. The lined-up vehicles are driven by additional volunteers, some of them nurses, but most of them unaffiliated individuals and families that are willing to give up a few hours on their holiday to make the meal deliveries, to allow the (all year long) delivery employees an opportunity to spend time with their families. *Our communications support* helps with directing the arriving vehicles into position for registration, meal and supply fulfillment and then directing the vehicles safely out of the area. 


White Elephant Gift Exchange

This year's rules for the white elephant gift exchange:


- 1. Bring a gift. Each player brings one wrapped gift (with value of \$20.)
- 2. Determine Order. Players draw numbers to determine the order in which they take turns.
- 3. **Take turns.** The first person selects and opens a gift and their turn ends. On subsequent turns, players can either steal another player's gift or open a new gift. The player whose gift is stolen can either steal another player's gift or open a new gift. The 2nd player whose gift is stolen, selects a new gift.
- 4. Limit steals. A gift can only be stolen twice, and the third person to have it keeps it.
- 5. **Final round.** In the final round, the first player can keep their gift or steal another guest's gift. The game ends when everyone has a gift.

2025 Youth on the Air Camp Application Period Open

Applications are now being accepted for campers interested in attending the 2025 Youth on the Air Camp. Licensed amateur radio operators, ages 15 through 25, who want to attend are encouraged to apply online at <u>YouthOnTheAir.org</u>. The camp is scheduled to take place June 15 -20, 2025, in Thornton (Denver), Colorado and the <u>Denver Radio Club</u>, an ARRL Affiliated Club, is the local host.



The current application period is for the fifth camp for young amateur radio operators in North, Central, and South America. For the best chance at being selected, applications should be submitted by 2359Z on January 15, 2025. Campers will be selected by the working group and notified by February 1.

To encourage attendance from across the Americas, allocations for campers are being held open for various areas of North, Central, and South America. If countries do not use their allocation or should someone within an allocation decline acceptance, those positions will be filled from the remaining pool of applicants. As this will be an ongoing process, everyone will not receive notification of acceptance at the same time. Preference will be given to first-time attendees.

Applications will continue to be accepted through May 1 and up to 50 campers will be accepted. The application process is free, but a \$100 USD deposit is required upon acceptance. Should a potential camper be unable to pay the \$100 deposit, they may apply for a scholarship or waiver. Campers are also responsible for their own arrival and departure transportation to the camp location. Travel assistance may also be available, especially for those traveling from outside of the USA and Canada. Travel during camp events is provided.

What is Amateur Radio (Ham Radio?) from ARRL

Amateur radio is a multifaceted hobby that includes people around the world. There are about 740,000 ham radio operators in the US. The FCC has allocated <u>30 different frequency bands</u> from 135 KHz to greater than 275 GHz to amateur radio operators. These frequency bands are used for many different aspects of the hobby.
